

**Responding to Covid-19 in the Falkland Islands**

- If you have Covid-19 symptoms, you should self-isolate and contact KEMH for advice
- FIG will keep you regularly updated about the best ways to stay safe during a Covid-19 outbreak by publishing advice to help you make decisions. This could include not taking part in high risk activities, writing social diaries, reducing the number of people you mix with and keeping extra distance between yourself and others
- If the situation becomes more serious and the number of infected people goes up, FIG’s position may change from advising you to do things in a certain way to directing you to behave differently. This will be done through regulations approved by Executive Council

**No cases in the Falkland Islands**



You can meet and mix with people freely and no one is self-isolating (apart from people in quarantine)



Everywhere is open and you can access local health services normally



Test and trace arrangements are in place to help identify people who may be infected after someone they have had contact with has a positive Covid-19 test



KEMH is surveillance swabbing to help check that there is no Covid-19 in the Falkland Islands



The number of people arriving from overseas may be limited and tourists may not be permitted to enter. Anyone entering may be required to quarantine for 14 days unless special arrangements have been made



If you are not in quarantine, you can travel freely around the Falkland Islands

**Individual cases in the Falkland Islands**



People at the greatest risk of severe consequences following a Covid-19 infection may be asked to self-isolate



Social gatherings can continue and advice will be published to help keep these as safe as possible



Nurseries and childminders are being helped to stay open by the Education Department in the safest possible way



All schools, the library and college are open and are working in ways that reduce the risk of Covid-19 spreading



Only businesses and services who can work in ways that limit the risk of infections spreading between people are open. If businesses who can't work in these ways do not close, ExCo can use regulations to force them to



Businesses that can't open, can access financial support to help them and their employees



Test and trace arrangements are in place to help identify people who may be infected after someone they have had contact with has a positive Covid-19 test



KEMH is surveillance swabbing across all communities to help FIG understand if Covid-19 is spreading



Routine health services may alter and could include changing how you access health care if you live in Camp to reduce the risk of infection spreading from one place to another and which services are available at KEMH



WBS and FIGAS may change how they work and this could include operating freight and supply services only



Only a limited number of people are able to come to the Falkland Islands from overseas (residents, their families and essential workers) and for those who do arrive, quarantine is in place



Movement around the islands may be restricted to reduce the risk of Covid-19 spreading. This will be decided by ExCo and implemented through regulations

**Cluster of Covid-19 in the Falkland Islands**



People at a high risk of severe consequences following a Covid-19 infection may also be asked to self-isolate



You will be asked to keep social contact limited to your own household bubble



Nurseries and childminders may be closed



Schools may be closed and only emergency child care may be available. You can use it if you have an essential job role that can't be done from home



Only essential businesses and services can open and they must work in ways that limit the risk of infections spreading between people



Businesses that can't open, can access financial support to help them and their employees



Test and trace arrangements are in place to help identify people who may be infected after someone they have had contact with has a positive Covid-19 test



KEMH is surveillance swabbing across all communities to help FIG understand how far Covid-19 has spread



Routine health services may alter and could include changing how you access health care if you live in Camp to reduce the risk of infection spreading from one place to another and which services are available at KEMH



WBS and FIGAS will change how they work and this could include operating freight and supply services only



Only a limited number of people are able to come to the Falkland Islands from overseas (residents and essential workers) and for those who do arrive, regulated quarantine is in place



Movement around the islands will be restricted to reduce the risk of Covid-19 spreading. This will be decided by ExCo and implemented through regulations

**Widespread outbreak across the Falkland Islands**



Everyone will be asked to self-isolate (lockdown) and only leave their home for essential journeys



You must limit contact to people who are inside your own household bubble



Nurseries and childminders will be closed



Schools will be closed and only emergency child care is available. You can use it if you have an essential job role that can't be done from home



Only essential businesses and services can open and they must work in ways that limit the risk of infections spreading between people are open



Businesses that can't open, can access financial support to help them and their employees



Test and trace arrangements will no longer be in place as the outbreak has become so widespread. Surveillance swabbing will also stop



Movement around the islands will continue to be restricted to reduce the risk of Covid-19 spreading



Access to health care in both Camp and Stanley has changed to free up resources to look after Covid-19 patients and reduce the risk of infections spreading



WBS and FIGAS have changed how they work and this could include operating freight and supply services only



Only a limited number of people are able to come to the Falkland Islands from overseas (residents and essential workers). Quarantine arrangements will be kept under review



Additional regulations may be needed and this will be done through a Proclamation of Emergency
