

Countryside Code

- Keep to paths wherever possible. Leave gates open or shut as you find them.
- Be aware of the high fire risks. Be extremely careful when smoking not to start fires.
- Do not drop litter. Take your rubbish home with you.
- Do not disfigure rocks or buildings.
- Do not touch, handle, injure or kill any wild bird or other wild animal.
- Never feed wild animals.
- Always give animals the right of way. Do not to block the routes of animals coming ashore to their colonies.
- Prevent disturbance to wild animals. Stay on the outside of bird and seal colonies. Remain at least 6 m (20 ft) away. When taking photograph or filming, stay low to the ground, move slowly and quietly. Do not startle or chase wildlife.
- Some plants are protected and should not be picked. Wildflowers are there for all to enjoy.
- Whalebones, skulls, eggs or other such items should be left where they are found.

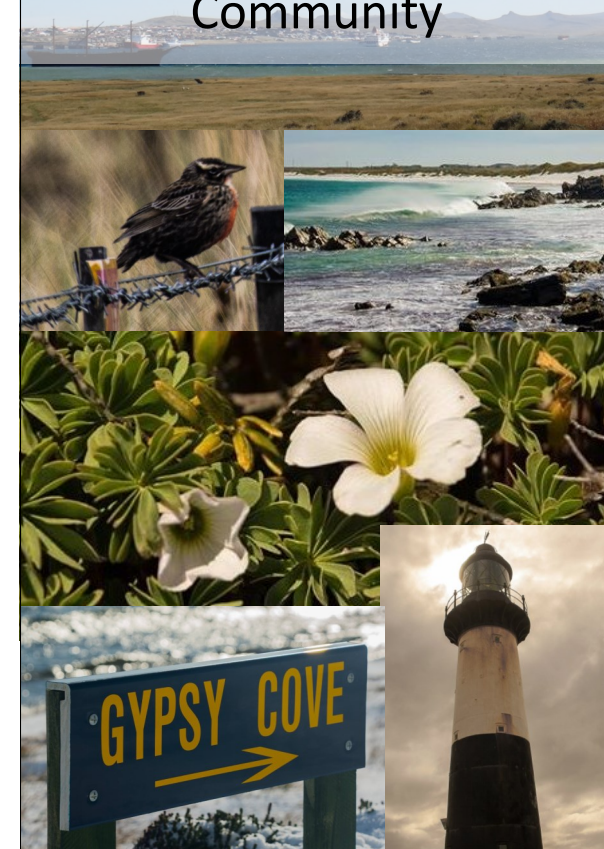

What has changed?

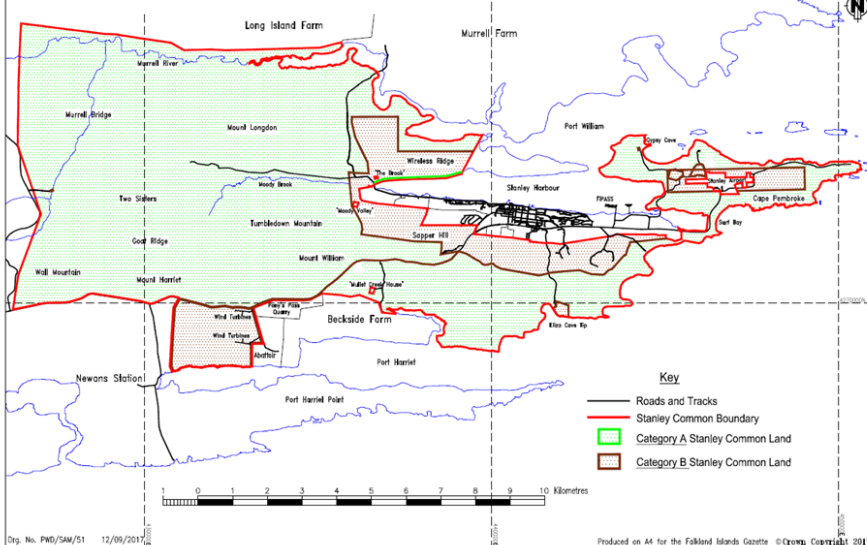
Community Focused: Stanley Common belongs to all of us. FIG listened to what you had to say and provide a clearer community focus.

Where is Stanley Common?



Respecting Stanley Common:

- ✓ **Going berrying?** If you are collecting berries, or plants, only collect these for your own personal consumption.
- ✓ **Planning a BBQ?** Please only light fires away from vegetation, on a rocky or sandy surface.
- ✓ **Rubbish?** Place this into a bin or take your rubbish home with you.
- ✓ **Visiting Our Memorials?** Our memorials are there for us to remember. Please leave these as you find them.
- ✓ **Respect Nature:** Please follow the Countryside Code on the back.
- ✓ **Taking your dog for a walk?** Please make sure your pet is under control and not chasing anyone or any wildlife. Please pick up your dog's mess and throw it away, don't leave it to someone else.
- ✓ **Going for a drive?** Avoid any sand and duned areas and stick to tracks. Avoid areas that are too soft and boggy.
